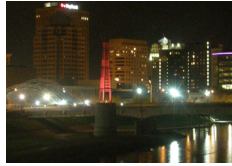




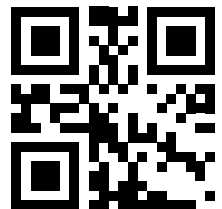

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

Services: Daybreak changes lives and creates new futures for homeless, at-risk, and troubled youth ages 10 to 24 in the Dayton region. Daybreak serves youth and young adults in crisis through emergency shelter, transitional housing, street outreach, and employment services. Daybreak is the region's only housing program designed to move homeless youth ages 18 to 24 out of homelessness, poverty, under-education, and crisis and into housing, financial independence, educational achievement, and self-sufficiency.

Hours: 24 hours a day, seven days a week. Youth may reach Daybreak via the 24-hour crisis hotline.

Eligibility: *Emergency Shelter* – any troubled, at-risk or homeless youth between the ages of 10 and 19 are eligible to stay in the emergency shelter unless they have a known history of repeated or extreme violence or sexual offenses. *Street Outreach* – any troubled, at-risk or homeless youth up to age 24 may visit the Street Outreach Center for food, necessities and assistance in finding a safe place to live. *Transitional Housing* – Must be referred by the Daybreak's emergency shelter, street outreach program, or another Montgomery County approved emergency shelter.

Students attending the Webster Street Academy remain actively enrolled in their current school, are generally able to participate in after school functions, and are awarded credit for the completion of academic work with the ultimate goal being the student’s successful re-integration to their home school.

Services include: counseling, anger management, specialized diagnostic assessments, and case management.

Eligibility: Youth ages ten and younger who have been referred to Juvenile Court for allegedly being unruly or having committed serious felony offenses are eligible to participate. Youth without charges (walk-ins) can also be served by the program.

Services: Assertive Community Treatment (ACT): Provides an intensive team-based, person centered recovery approach. ACT is for individuals who have the most serious symptoms of severe mental illness/ substance abuse and who, consequently, have the greatest difficulty with basic daily activities.

CAMI: Chemically Addicted Mental Illness services. The care is 16 to 18 weeks with weekly follow up sessions designed to provide long term recovery support. The interventions outlined in the treatment plan are oriented towards recover, abstinence, maintenance, and stabilization. Persons receive individual and group counseling related to substance abuse and mental illness, in addition to receiving Med somatic (psychiatric medication) services from a physician, if needed. (Also offered at Focus Care location.)

One-on-one chemical dependency counseling is provided on-site as well as tele-counseling sessions from the privacy of your own home if you choose. 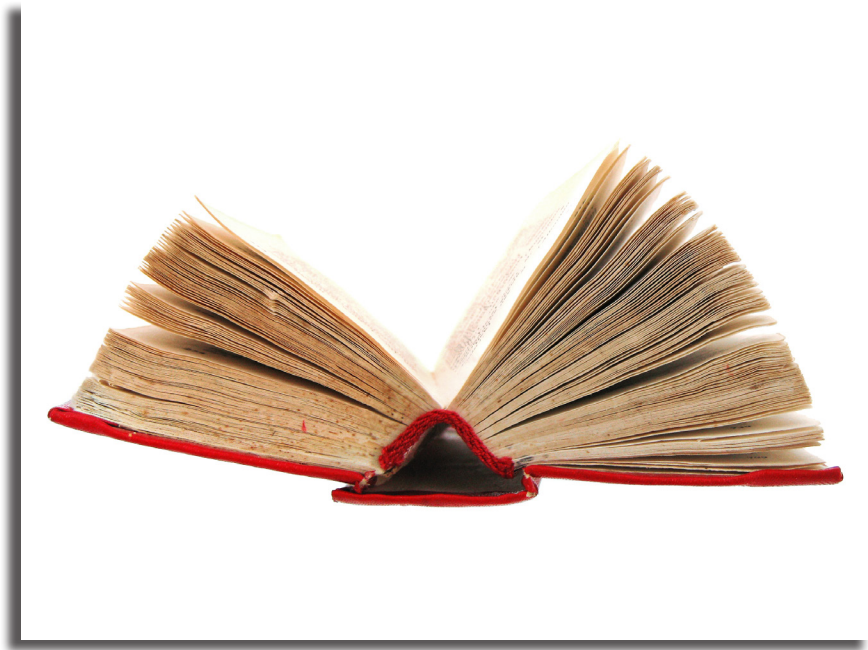

Heroin

- Dry mouth
- Alternately awake and drowsy poor mental functioning
- Disorientation
- Shallow breathing
- Injection marks on arms or body

Cocaine

- Large pupils
- Alertness
- Talkative/fast speech
- Runny or bloody nose
- Presence of mirrors/spoons/razorblades/rolled money
- Sleeplessness

Marijuana

- Large pupils
- Rolling papers or other smoking devices/paraphernalia
- Smell of marijuana in room, car or on clothing
- Bloodshot eyes
- Sleepiness
- Lack of motivation

Alcohol

- Slurred speech
- Impaired coordination
- Signs of throwing up
- Bottles saved as souvenirs
- Smell of alcohol on breath/clothing

When should I call the police?

If you feel there is a crisis situation or the situation is dangerous, call the police (imminent danger, suicide threat, assaultive/erratic behavior, overdose).

What are the signs of overdose?

Signs may include nausea, vomiting, dizziness, diarrhea, seizures, inability to wake, abdominal cramps, seizure, abnormal pulse, cold or hot skin temperature, rapid or slow breathing.

Common Signs and Symptoms:

Physical Warning Signs

- Bloodshot eyes, pupils larger or smaller than usual; using eye drops to mask these signs
- Changes in appetite or sleep patterns. Sudden weight loss or weight gain
- Deterioration of physical appearance, personal grooming habits
- Unusual smells on breath, body, or clothing
- Slurred speech or impaired coordination
- Avoiding eye contact, locking doors, demanding privacy
- Frequent nosebleeds

Behavioral Signs

- Skipping class, declining grades, poor attendance at work or school
- Complaints from coworkers, teachers, friends/peers
- Unexplained need for money or financial problems.
- Missing money, valuables, prescriptions
- Sudden change in friends or hobbies; secretive about new friends
- Increased interest in drug/alcohol lifestyle related music, posters, clothing

Psychological Warning Signs

- Unexplained change in personality or attitude
- Mood swings, irritability, or angry outbursts
- Periods of unusual hyperactivity, agitation, or giddiness
- Lack of motivation; appears lethargic or “spaced out”
